

The Diploma in Care Level 2 has been written in line with the minimum requirements set out by Skills for Care and Skills for Health and confirms the competence of those who work in health and adult care services in England.

The Level 2 Diploma in Care (RQF) will link with the knowledge and skills required within the Adult Care and Healthcare sector. Supporting roles such as adult care worker, healthcare assistant/support worker and personal assistant.

### **Duration on Programme**

• 6 - 9 months.
